Ethos of the School

The School regards independence, self-motivation, self-confidence and self-esteem as vital components in the makeup of an individual and undertakes to encourage children to develop these qualities during their time at the School.

This is achieved through providing a homely, nurturing environment where every child is supported by knowledgeable, caring and committed teachers. A wide variety of activities which are timetabled, supports this aim. We have no extracurricular subjects - everything is timetabled so that for example, all Year 1 and 2 children enjoy learning a stringed instrument. Swimming lessons, Dance, Drama, Carpentry and Singing are all included in the curriculum. In this way every child benefits from our provision, regardless of any parental decisions. Children need to succeed and providing a variety of different experiences gives them the opportunity to find something they may excel at. The happiness of every child at the school is paramount and without this they cannot flourish. By providing a wide range of activities within a supportive, friendly, and nurturing environment along with a caring staff, we are able to achieve this aim.

A system of rewards and sanctions which encourages good behaviour and kindness towards their peers, operates in the school and involves all the classes.
